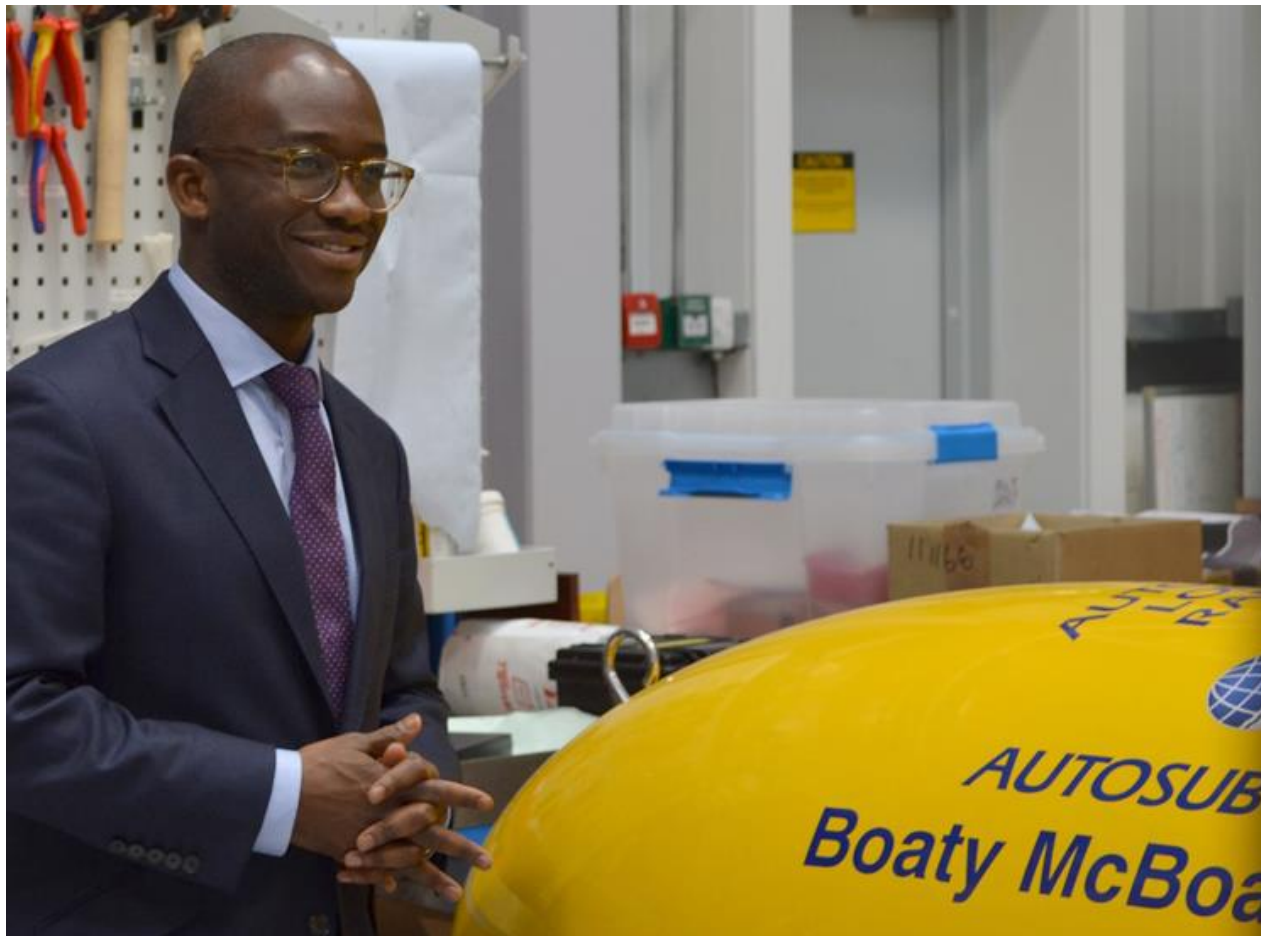

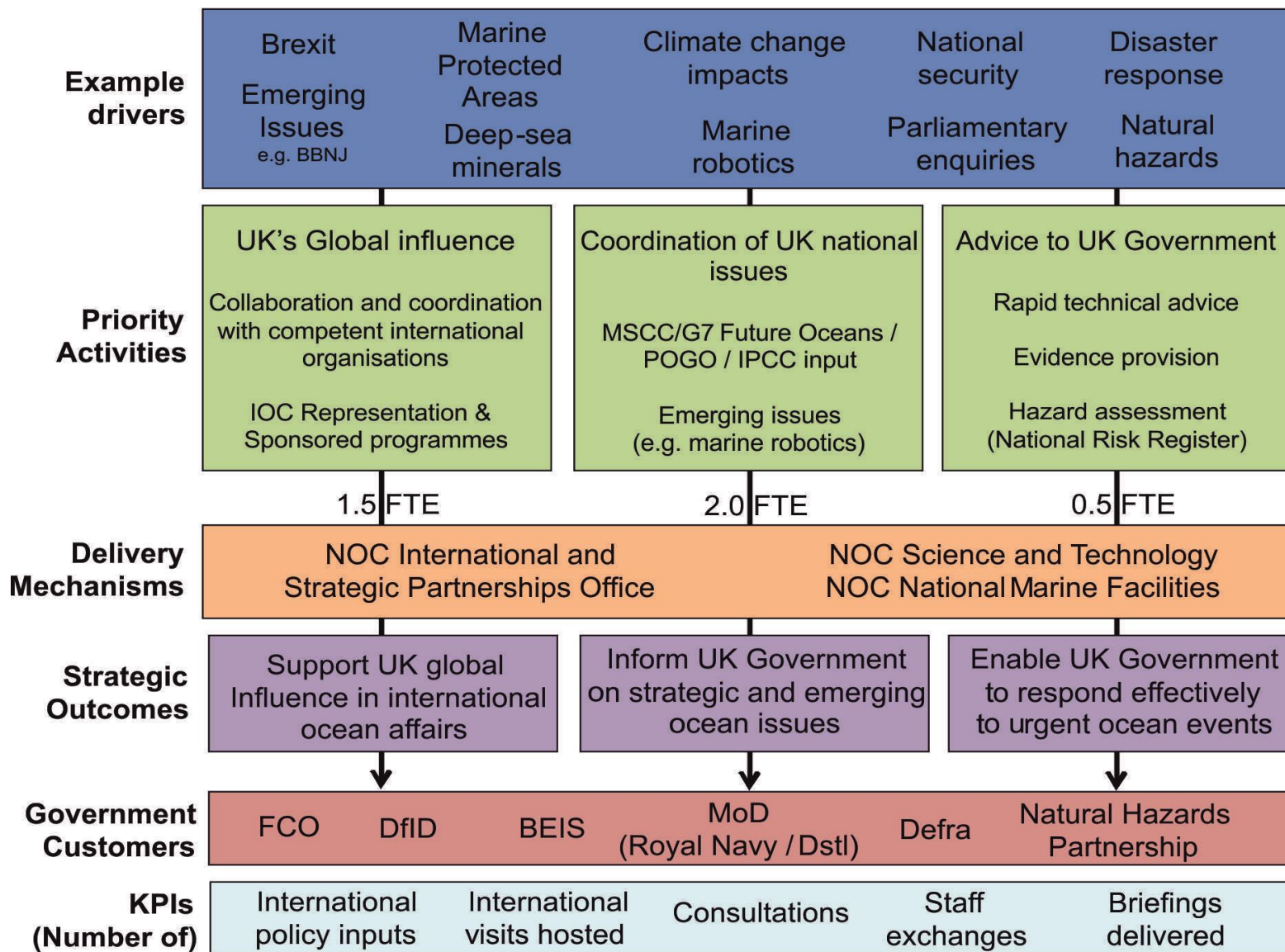

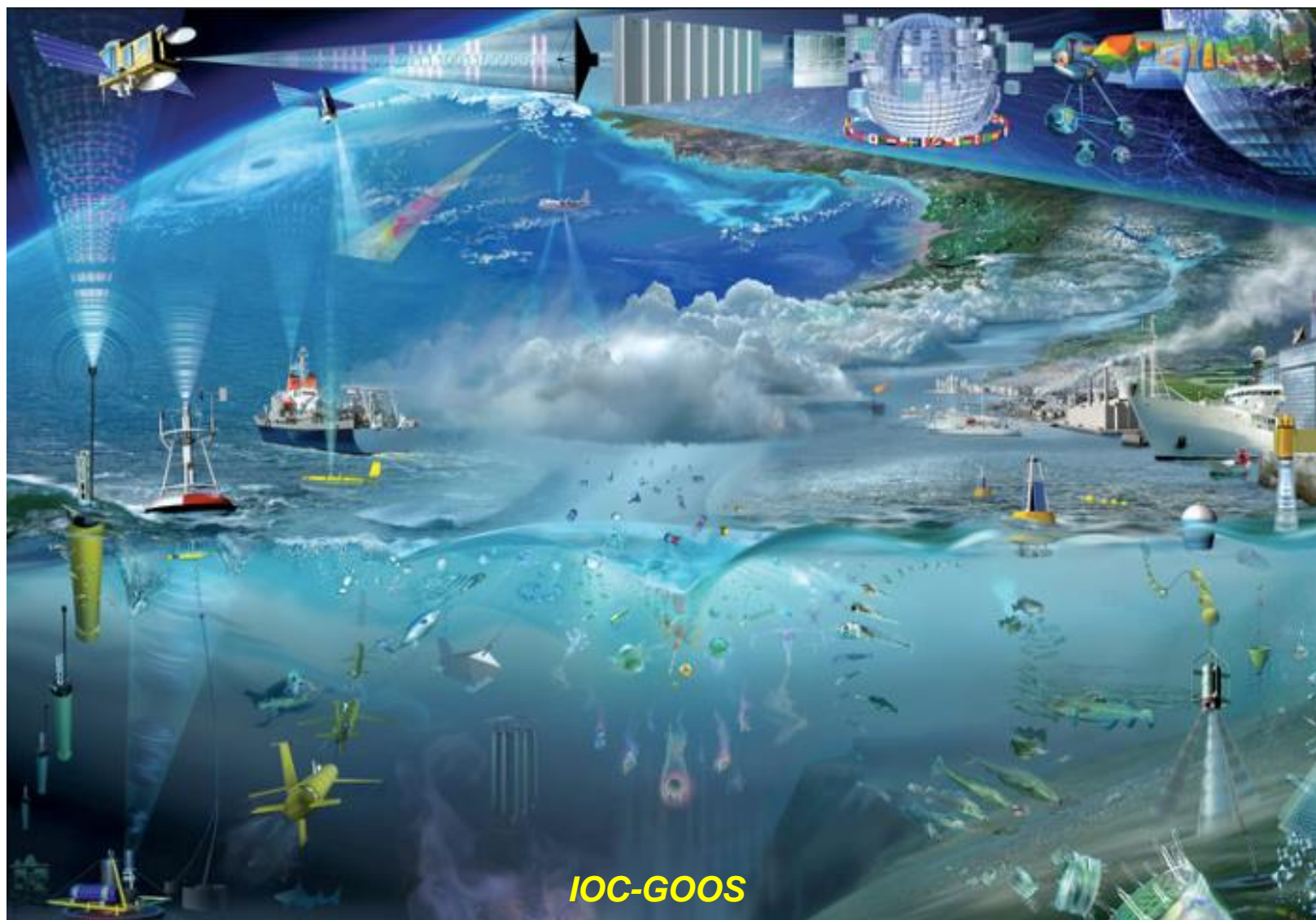


# Indicative framework (with selected examples) for delivery of NOC NC-NPG

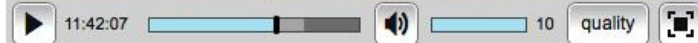

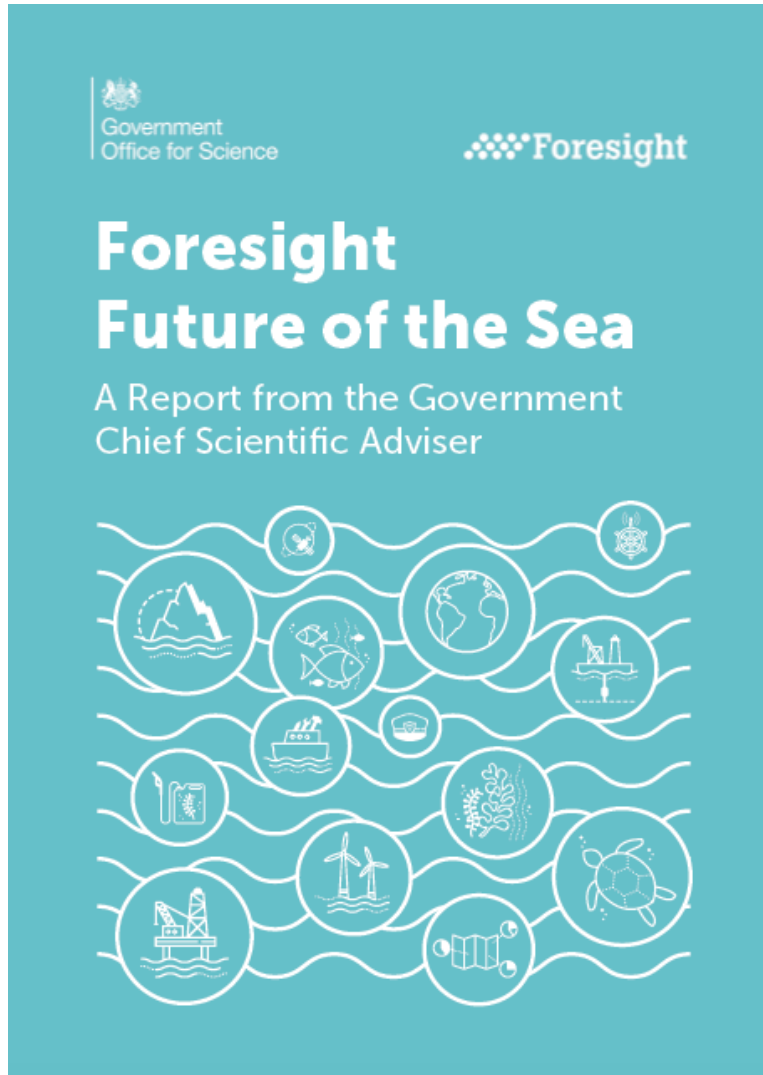
